



Institutions are set up under their own Ordinances. Institutions (not UGC) control:






Terms of Reference

- To keep under review in light of the community's needs for publicly-funded universities and institutions in HK:
 - facilities
 - plans for development
 - financial needs
- > To advise Government on:
 - applications of funds for education in UGC-funded institutions; and
 - aspects of higher education which the Chief Executive may refer to the UGC



UGC Structure



Groups to deal with:

- Strategy
- Research policy matters
- General administration
- Communications

Ad hoc groups as required (HKIEd Development, Academic Development Proposal, Institutions' Financial Affairs)



UGC Members

- > Appointed by the Chief Executive, in their personal capacity
- Local and non-local members, lay members as well as academics

- Members open in giving their independent advice with reference to international standard and practices
- Each UGC Member appointed into different groups/subcommittees



Characteristics of UGC Funding

- Funding by the triennium (2012-15, 2016-19)
 - Provide, to a large extent, predictability and stability in resources
- Roll-over year (2008/09, 2015/16)
 - Roll-over arrangement: A simple extension of the approved financial arrangements following the preceding funding triennium
- Block grants to institutions
 - Provide maximum flexibility

Research Group

Terms of Reference:

 - b. how it should formulate a strategy in allocating publicly-funded research postgraduate places
 - c. the balance between teaching and research within the UGC-funded institutions and of the whole sector in general

- Non-local academics (4)




Funding for Academic Research

- ➤ The Government provides funding for academic research to the 8 higher education institutions mainly through the University Grants Committee (UGC) and its Research Grants Council (RGC)
- ➤ This constitutes the major source of research funding for the 8 institutions, making up about 74% of their total research expenditure



Research Expenditure of 8 Institutions

Funding Sources

UGC Block Grant (Yellow Portion, overseen by UGC)

Provides research support (e.g. infra-structure, overhead) directly to institutions (about HK\$4.0 billion for 2015/16 roll-over year)

Allocation based on –

- Results of Research Assessment Exercise
- Success in obtaining RGC Earmarked Research Grants
- Provides funding for RPg places to institutions and Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme (about HK\$1.8 billion for 2015/16 roll-over year)



Funding Sources (Cont'd)

Research Endowment Fund (Blue Portion, overseen by RGC)

- Set up in 2009 with HK\$18 billion endowment
- Topped up by HK\$5 billion in 2012/13, of which about \$3 billion is designated for the selffinancing degree sector

Sector	Fund	Estimated Investment income per year
UGC-Funded	HK\$20 billion	HK\$1 billion
Self-financing	HK\$3 billion	HK\$150 million
