8,700 university students participate in Common English Proficiency Assessment Scheme

The University Grants Committee (UGC) announced today (November 4) that about 8,700 final year students of UGC-funded undergraduate degree programmes had registered for the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) under the third round of the Common English Proficiency Assessment Scheme (CEPAS). This is comparable to the number of participants in 2002-03 and 2003-04.

A UGC spokesman said the successful launch of CEPAS in 2002-03 was marked by the participation of over 7,300 final year students. In 2003-04, about 8,700 students joined the scheme. "With the assistance of our institutions, the third round of registration for the scheme in 2004-05 has just been successfully completed," the spokesman said.

"We are pleased to see that the scheme has continued to attract a large number of students. About 8,700 final year students have submitted their applications this time. Given the voluntary nature of the CEPAS, the participation demonstrates that the students attach importance to their English proficiency."

The UGC announced the adoption of IELTS as the testing instrument for CEPAS in July, 2002. This is the third year of implementation of the scheme, and registration was carried out from mid-September to late-October. A breakdown of the number of participants by institution is at the <u>Annex</u> for reference. The testing sessions will be run from November this year to May next year.
