

The project will delineate the symbiosis between early movie shows and established forms of entertainment in Hong Kong; it will also explain the relations between screen culture with colonial governance in that the cinema practice is part of the aggregate of institutional, physical, and administrative mechanisms and knowledge structures that maintain and enhance the exercise of power within society.
