5.3 Realisation of the objectives

This 42-month project aimed to develop a competence enhancement training program for prospective social workers and teachers in Hong Kong by achieving four objectives.

Objective 1: To identify the current level of knowledge and attitudes towards intersexuality among registered social workers and teachers in Hong Kong.

This objective was achieved by the first stage of the study. The first stage is an background exploratory research was carried out between March and November 2017 to identify the level of knowledge and attitudes toward intersex among social workers and teachers. The finding of this stage provided crucial background information for proceeding to Stage 2.

Objective 2: To develop a sustainable competence enhancement training program in addressing intersexuality for prospective social workers and teachers.

This objective was achieved by the second stage of the study. The second stage was an evaluation study on the proposed competence enhancement training program which was carried out between March and November 2018.

Objective 3: To initiate discussion and raise awareness of the needs of intersexuality in the Chinese community.

This objective was achieved by the second stage of the study. Another crucial component of the second stage is the international conference that was held in January 27, 2018 in HKBU (<u>https://etsuiyl.wixsite.com/intersex-symposium</u>) to address intersex. More than 200 audiences from various background, including physicians, nurses, psychologist, social workers, educators, researchers, legal professionals, activists, journalists and human resources personnel, had attended the conference. A good level of newspaper coverage and radio interviews helped to bring awareness and initiate discussion towards the topic of intersex/DSD.

Objective 4: To validate a training framework in competence enhancement and to extend this framework to frontline professionals working with other sexual minorities.

This objective was achieved by the third stage of the study. The third stage was originally scheduled to be running a series of community outreach seminars between March 2019 and November 2019. However, due to the social unrest that started in June 2019, some of the scheduled seminars were postponed. In light of this, an request to extend the study was made and approved in August 2019. Subsequently, the unexpected COVID pandemic has led to the modification of the delivery mode. The remaining two seminars were conducted in the form of Zoom webinar between March and May 2020.

6. Research Outcome

6.1 Major findings and research outcome (Maximum 1 page; please make reference to Part C where necessary)

This 42-month project aimed to develop a competence enhancement training program for prospective social workers and teachers and it was conducted through three stages.

For the first stage, an background exploratory research was carried out to identify the level of knowledge and attitudes toward intersex among social workers and teachers. Six focus groups were conducted in HKBU, HKU and EdUHK to examine the level of knowledge and attitudes towards intersex among social worker and teacher trainees. The findings has revealed a high level of awareness and acceptance towards intersex. However, their professional knowledge related to intersex seem to be lagged behind, which potentially diminished their competence in providing counselling and psychological services to the clients with intersex status. This finding helps providing crucial background information for proceeding to Stage 2.

For the second stage, prospective social workers and teachers were invited to take part in the competence enhancement training program. With the adoption of drama education technique, a total of four experiential-oriented competence-training workshops were held between March and November 2018. These workshops have been highly valued by the participants and it has revealed that participants acknowledged their lack of knowledge on the dilemma encountered by the affected individuals and their family members. Participants has also mentioned that public ignorance leads to stigmatization and eventually to the self-concealment of people with intersex. It was suggested that, in order to break this vicious cycle, not only training for frontline professionals is needed, so as public education.

In addition, at the second stage, an international conference was conducted in January 27, 2018 in (https://etsuiyl.wixsite.com/intersex-symposium) to address intersex. HKBU Using an interdisciplinary approach, speakers included researcher, clinical psychologist, paediatrist consultant, barrister and an activist who was born with intersex characteristics gave the audiences a comprehensive understanding on the issue of DSD. An survey study had carried out and showed that participation in the symposium enhanced audiences' level of knowledge on intersex, including intersex-related terminology, variations of intersex conditions and their respective physiological characteristics. The results has also indicated that audiences' attitudes towards intersex had improved, especially in the aspect of providing peer support and the importance of autonomy when it comes to the genital surgeries for intersex people.

For the third stage, a series of public education and community outreach workshops was conducted between March 2019 and May 2020. Debriefing sessions after these workshops had revealed that that prior knowledge on intersex was limited. For instance, intersex was often mistaken with transgender and bisexuality. And it was also noted that the acceptance towards intersex raised significantly when general public recognize intersex is a biological/ genetic condition. Moreover, the prevalence of intersex was also under-estimated by the public. This results indicated that more public engagement on the topic of DSD is needed.

6.2 Potential for further development of the research and the proposed course of action (Maximum half a page)

With the support of this current grant, an international conference named "Is it a boy or a girl?" The Limit of the Male-Female Binary: Hong Kong First Interdisciplinary Symposium on Intersexuality" was able to hold in 2018. This conference focused on discussing the comprehensive needs of people with DSD. It had attracted audiences from different professions, including physicians, nurses, psychologist, social workers, educators, researchers, legal professionals. In particular there were more than 15 medical professionals from several hospitals in Mainland. Subsequently, PI was the invited speaker for the 3rd and 4th Training Symposium on DSD organized by Shenzhen Children Hospital in May 2018 and Oct 2019. These has facilitated the first collaboration work with Shenzhen Children Hospital which will be resulted in the next longitudinal study on the psychosocial needs of parents who have given birth to children with DSD.

7. Layman's Summary

Disorder/ difference in sexual development (DSD), also known as intersex, is a general term referring to an individual who is born with a reproductive anatomy that does not fit the typical gender binary system in society. This 42-month 3-stage project aimed to develop a competence training model for frontline professionals with cultural sensitivity. By conducting a exploratory research (stage 1) on the level of knowledge and attitudes of frontline professionals, it reveals there were generally ignorance about the conditions and the psychosocial needs of these individuals. Moreover, by running several training workshops for frontline professionals (stage 2), it indicated that participants found these workshops very useful in terms of increasing their knowledge on the dilemma facing by affected individuals and their family members as well as enhancing their empathy towards affected families. At the same time, an international conference were held which had attracted more than 200 audience from different professionals. Combining both the international conference (stage 2) with the community outreach workshops (stage 3), it has served the ultimate goal of initiating discussion in the Chinese community in acknowledging the needs of this silent and underrepresented population group.
