



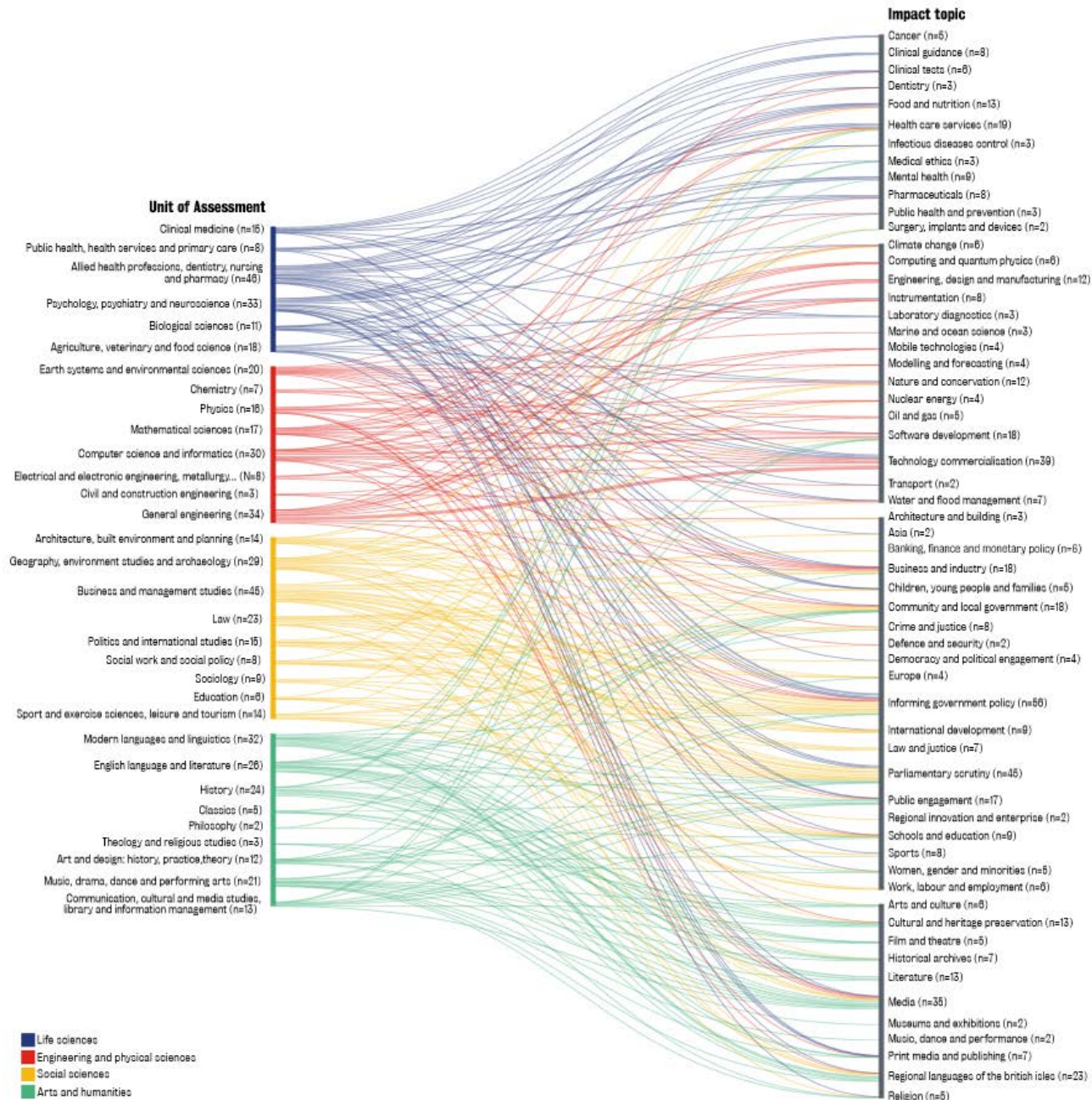

Figure 5: Alluvial connectivity linking UoA to impact topic

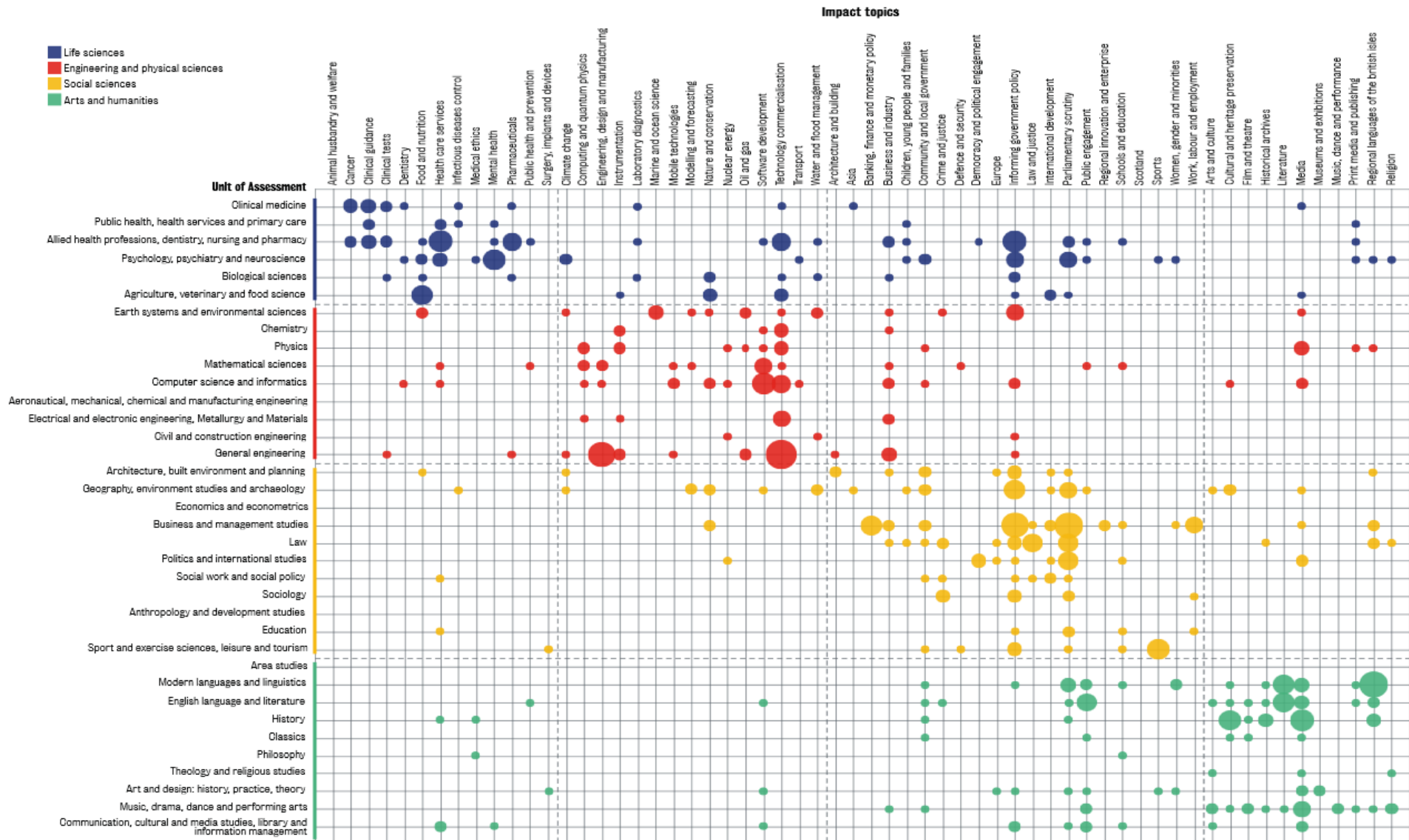

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RAE2020 Range of Impact

Social Sciences

Policy or public debate has been **stimulated or informed by research** evidence.

Adoption in public discourse by stakeholders and commentators of conceptual tools and empirical evidence.

Developing **new ways of estimating** key, policy relevant statistical outputs.

RAE 2020 Evidence of Impact

Types of supporting evidence: **Social Sciences**

- Documented **changes to public policy / legislation / regulations / guidelines.**
- **Formal acknowledgements** of and/or evaluations by relevant beneficiaries, bodies and organisations.
- Application or **incorporation in professional best practice**, training and continuing development materials.

RAE 2020 Range & Evidence of Impact: **Education**

Research shows that certain educational practice is likely to benefit learners. A practitioner support network was created, & the researchers worked with it to undertake CPD & produce materials for wider dissemination. 'N' practitioners have attended CPD, & the practice is now part of the CPD

RAE 2020 Range & Evidence of Impact: **Education**

Research identified an effective approach to **improving the engagement of whole families** in difficult-to-reach communities. The findings were picked up by a regional government outside of Hong Kong, & used for an **approach to engagement with families** from difficult-to-reach communities. 'N' schools were involved in the project, reaching 'Y' families.

RAE 2020 Range of Impact: Law

Influencing the development or **application of law by courts.**

Helping professionals & organisations adapt to changing socio-economic, political and legal environments.

Influencing curriculum in schools, eg via widespread use of text books or an IT resource.

Influencing the methods, ideas or ethics of the legal profession.

RAE 2020 Evidence of Impact: Law

- ***Citations & reviews in non-academic users' documents*** such as court judgments, counsels' written submissions to courts, policy documents, reports of law reform bodies, and civil-society reports.
- ***Independent testimony*** – acknowledgement in publications, testimony of experts or third party
- ***Public engagement*** – Media coverage, downloads of linked resources, web access count.

RAE 2020 Assessing Impact

Basis of evaluating impact –

- the submitting unit/university is to present *how it made a distinct and material contribution* to the impact in the assessment period
- such that the impact *would not have occurred* or would have been significantly reduced without the contribution of research

RAE 2020 Assessing Impact

Some Do's/Don'ts

- The Summary section of the Impact Case Study should clearly **summarise the Impact being claimed** (i.e. what has changed) with a brief indication of its reach & significance. It should not be an abstract of the whole Case Study or a description of the underlying research.
- **Credibility**: are there reasonable grounds for the claimed impact, bearing in mind other factors or organizations could have contributed to impact?
- **Evidence**: is there a clear account of **evidence that links the research with the claimed impact**?
- Look at some **published case studies**, and at guidance for neighbouring UoAs – might stimulate ideas
